Deft says that complt's demand has no foundations far as the "stiver money" is concerned, but does not refuse him his daily wager. (het daghloon)

Deft also requests whereas in his quality of Schout, before this, he also held the office of secretary, that he may receive from complt one half of the money for the summons till the end of his first year in office, according to the customs of this country.

The hon. court decides that complt shall receive from deft in regard to the sales (vendues) 3 gldrs; and in regard to the judicial sales (execution) 6 gldrs for daily wage. Complt is also ordered to pay deft one half of the money for the summons, in accordance with deft's request, and [further orders] parties to settle with each other concerning the same.

Complt demands from deft (in whose place appear the guardians Roelof Swartwout and Cornelis Barentsen Slecht) the physician's fee, being 5 beavers. Deft's guardians answer to have been informed that complt has settled concerning the same with Jan Peersen who has hurt deft.

Complt answers and denies having settled, but says that he had a talk with Jan Peersen, at the time the patient was going to the Manhatans about having earned 5 beavers with her, and if it should cost 5 more beavers [said Peersen] would not object to paying the same if the patient only should not keep a stiff leg, where upon Complt Mr Gysbert Van Imbroch, answered Jan Peersen "If any surgeon at the Manhatans says that the patient has not been well cured, or that her case should not have been well treated, he does not want anything for it." The hon. court decides that complt shall settle with deft or her guardians concerning the surgeon's fee, in consideration of the fact that deft has been fully cured at the Manhattans.
